

PhD Fellowships in Structural Engineering

Professor Jin-Guang Teng (滕锦光) of the Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering, The Hong Kong Polytechnic University, intends to nominate one or two outstanding candidates to compete for funding support by the prestigious Hong Kong PhD Fellowship Scheme. Professor Teng's current research interests include the structural use of fibre reinforced polymer (FRP) composites, life-cycle performance of structures, seismic assessment and retrofit of structures, and steel & thin-walled structures. The Fellowship provides a monthly stipend of HK\$20,000 (approximately US\$2,600) as well as conference and research related travel allowance of HK\$10,000 (approximately US\$1,300) per year for three years. Successful applicants should normally be within the top 5% of his/her undergraduate class from a leading university and has an excellent mastery of English (e.g. an IELTS score not lower than 7). A master's degree with significant research outcomes is an advantage but is not essential. Undergraduate students who will obtain their bachelor degree by the summer of 2015 are eligible and welcome to apply.
